

**House Group News:**

Ten folks from Melbourne, Ticknall and Stanton met again on the 31<sup>st</sup> July and experienced liturgy and song from the Iona Community along with acknowledging Ignatius of Loyola (founder of the Jesuit teachers) who's day it was. Ros gave us an insight into her decision to become a teacher and others present contributed as well. We found that in some cases the encouragement had come from older female members of the family who had not had the opportunity to train, and in other cases it had been a matter of doors opening one after another which had led to the teaching profession. But one person said that the encouragement came from someone who had felt spiritually led to make the suggestion. Some of us felt the whole idea of teaching quite daunting! Our prayers included teachers in schools, churches, and Junior Church, and those children across the world who are not given the opportunity of schooling.

We also took time to reflect briefly together on the lectionary reading for the day which was the demise of Judas and the appointment of Matthias; quite a deep and difficult passage from Acts and one which could well do with more time taken exploring it.

It is with sadness that we note the death last week of Roy Dunncliffe, our Archivist, - a true gentleman and a long standing friend of Melbourne Church.

Roy was Melbourne born and bred and with his parents, was a faithful worshipper at our Church and a close friend of a number of us in our younger years. He was a server, crucifer, PCC member and participant in the Church Drama Guild for many years. He spent his married life in Chellaston maintaining close and continuous links with the Church there.

Roy was a member of many Melbourne organisations including the Historical Research Group and Male Voice Choir - and established the Archivist role for our Church a decade ago.

Roy's funeral will be held on 24<sup>th</sup> August 10.30am at St Peter's Church, Chellaston, followed by burial at Elvaston *Roger Kington*

## **Music for Reflection Series 2018**

Those of you lucky enough to be at Lichfield Cathedral on Wednesday August 8<sup>th</sup> and not sailing round the Mediterranean or jetting off to some exotic island, walking locally, driving to Bognor Regis or taking a coach to Weston Super Mare (sorry! I get a bit carried away sometimes!) were privy to a wonderful lunchtime concert of Organ Music by Ed Turner, Assistant Director of Music at Derby Cathedral, previously Worcester College, Oxford, Tewkesbury Abbey, Dean Close School, Cheltenham and Southwell Minster - still very young with a magnificent head of hair and like all Organists I know an amusing turn of phrase. Ed's passion is choral music and accompanying the Anglican liturgy.

We listened to a varied programme in the "Music for Reflection Series 2018". Firstly, Prelude and Fugue in B Minor *Johann Sebastian Bach* (1685-1750). Secondly, Le Jardin Suspendu *Jehan Alain* (1911-1940). (The likes of which I had never heard before, an ethereal and otherworldly composition, most relaxing and calming.)

Lastly, Rubrics - A liturgical Suite for Organ, *Dan Lochlain* (b. 1949).

The rest of you missed a treat, do listen out for him, you are in for something special.

## The Readings at 8am and 10.30am:

### First Reading: *1 Kings 19.4-8*

But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: 'It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors.' Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, 'Get up and eat.' He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again. The angel of the Lord came a second time, touched him, and said, 'Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you.' He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food for forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

### The Gospel Reading: *John 6.35, 41-51*

Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.'


Then the Jews began to complain about him because he said, 'I am the bread that came down from heaven.' They were saying, 'Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, "I have come down from heaven"?' Jesus answered them, 'Do not complain among yourselves. No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me; and I will raise that person up on the last day. It is written in the prophets, "And they shall all be taught by God." Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me. Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. Very truly, I tell you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.'
