## **Bible Readings**

#### Collect

Risen Christ, your wounds declare your love for the world and the wonder of your risen life: give us compassion and courage to risk ourselves for those we serve, to the glory of God the Father.

#### Ist Reading: Acts 9.26-40

An angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.'

The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

#### Gospel Reading: John 15.1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.'

#### Melbourne Open Art Fair: 4-6 May - The Methodist Wesley Hall, Potter Street

You may have seen in the Village Voice that Arts Melbourne received an award from the Arts Council to run a series of FREE creative workshops for Melbourne and the surrounding villages with a particular focus on those in our community who are hard to engage in creativity, such as those isolated or lonely and blokes, (who are a problem at any age!).. We have run a number of these workshops, appropriately called 'Blossoming', this Spring and they have been over-subscribed. This Art Fair is to raise the necessary funds to match the Arts Council grant so we can continue the workshops through until October.

So far we have over 80 entrants who have entered a total of 300+ pieces, mostly paintings with a good 30 in ceramics, wood and silver. The majority are by local amateur artists who have produced some stunning work, with a good sprinkling of Festival and Gallery artists. Please come along and get some cracking bargains.

#### **Ministry Team News**

Following a meeting of the ministry team this week and in consultation with Mike Firbank our Area Dean and acting Incumbent we have agreed that from the Sunday 26th May, at Melbourne, we will start using the Nave Altar again until Advent.

We are also going to look at and experiment with reverting back to the order of service booklets and/ or hymn books or printed hymn sheets, and possibly still producing a service booklet for special occasions, festivals etc. This will be an experiment to see what works best. Some folk have asked about the Blessing and dismissal taking place at the back of church at the end of the service, but for now things will remain as they are – the final hymn, the Blessing and dismissal from in front of the altar and then the choir and clergy recess out to the organ voluntary.

We are also looking at holding a study course sometime in the autumn in a similar format to the successful Lent course this year, more details later. *Alan Winfield*

### ELY - WHAT TO SEE & DO

Ely Cathedral, Octagon Tour, Stained Glass Museum, take a River Trip, Jubilee Gardens, Oliver Cromwell's House, Cherry Hill Park, Waterside Antiques Centre – the largest in East Anglia.

Our Choir will sing Choral Evensong in the Cathedral at 5.30p.m., and it's a free day to do as you please. The coach will leave Church Square at 8.30a.m. Cost: £24 per seat for door to door with friendly, familiar faces.

#### This is a trip postponed from April 2020, right at the beginning of lockdown. Having sung Evensong in the Cathedral a number of times, we were due to sing in the Lady Chapel on that occasion, something which I'm delighted to say we will finally achieve this time.

The Ely Lady Chapel was built in the 14th Century and is the largest Lady Chapel attached to any British Cathedral. It is the building in which, because of its acoustic, many professional chamber choirs record, notably John Rutter's Cambridge Singers. They describe the acoustic as sublime, sumptuous, magnificent, peerless and we are fortunate indeed to have the opportunity to sing Choral Evensong in their Lady Chapel, something which is not afforded to many Visiting Choirs.
